Conditions of entry 2018

Geelong Gallery's *Who's who portrait prize* aims to encourage and inspire young artists to celebrate the Geelong region's people—their identity, history, creativity and culture—through portraiture.

Coinciding with the Geelong Gallery's presentation of the Art Gallery of New South Wales' *Archibald Prize 2018*, this student prize marks Jules Francois Archibald's connection to Geelong as his birthplace.

Selected entries from the *Who's who portrait prize 2018* will be exhibited across Geelong including at the Geelong Gallery, Geelong Regional Libraries, Westfield Shopping Centre and more.

The children's exhibition will be presented at the same time as Geelong Gallery's hosting of the 2018 Art Gallery of New South Wales' *Archibald Prize* presented from 22 September to 18 November 2018.

Prizes are awarded in five categories

- Kinder to Foundation
- Levels 1 to 3
- Levels 4 to 6
- Levels 7 to 9
- Levels 10 to VCE

A prize is also awarded to the artist whose portrait is nominated best in the *People's choice* category and will be announced on Wednesday 21 November 2018.

Closing date for entries, delivered to Geelong Gallery by 5.00pm: **Friday 10 August**

Who's who portrait prize finalists and winners announced: **Friday 14 September**

Who's who portrait prize exhibition dates: **Saturday 15 September to Sunday 18 November**

People's choice prize will be announced: **Wednesday 21 November**

All entries must be collected: **Friday 30 November** from Geelong Gallery

Conditions of entry 2018

School registration of intention to enter:

All students and schools must register their participation in the prize online by **Friday 20 July**, 5.00pm.

How to enter

— Portrait **MUST** be presented on A3 (42.0 cm x 29.7 cm) 200gsm paper in a portrait format, no mount please.

— Completed **entry form** securely pasted on the back of each artwork with students name and artists statements and details completed.

— A **photograph of the sitter** must be pasted to the back of the artwork; this image will be used in the judging process to assess the likeness of the sitter

— A completed **class list MUST** be attached to your student entries when submitting entries.

— **All entries must be delivered** to Geelong Gallery by **5.00pm Friday 10 August**. No late entries will be accepted.

Conditions of entry

1. Students may enter **one** artwork only.
2. Information on how to enter forms part of the terms and conditions of entry. Entry into the prize is deemed acceptance of these terms and conditions.
3. All artwork **MUST** be on A3 (42.0 cm x 29.7 cm) 200gsm paper in a portrait format, no mount please.
4. No three-dimensional pieces will be accepted.
5. An entry must be the original work.
6. Entries that are deemed offensive or derogatory will not be accepted.
7. No late entries will be accepted.
8. The Gallery shall appoint the judging panel that will, in the first instance, view all entries that comply with the conditions of entry and select a limited number of works for inclusion in the exhibition. The judging panel reserves the right to exhibit, or not exhibit, any work entered. The judging panel shall solely determine the prize-winning portraits for each category.
9. The judging panel's decision will be final and no correspondence will be entered into
10. The portraits must be available for display throughout the duration of the *Who's who portrait prize* exhibition 2018.
11. The Gallery reserves the right to exclude works that do not meet the required standard for display.

Conditions of entry 2018

11. The portraits must be available for display throughout the duration of the *Who's who portrait prize exhibition*.

12. The Gallery reserves the right to exclude works that do not meet the required standard for display.

13. Best practice in the handling and care of works will be implemented at all times by Gallery staff, however, the Gallery will not be responsible for any loss or damage suffered to any artwork in its possession or under its control and other exhibition venues.

14. All artworks must be collected on **Friday 30 November** between 10.00 am and 5.00 pm. Collection outside these hours must be arranged with the Gallery prior.

Judging criteria

1. Artwork adheres to the terms and conditions of the *Who's who portrait prize 2018*
2. Students expression of individual artistic intention when creating their portrait
3. Students ability to explore and manipulate different materials and use multiple techniques when creating their portrait
4. Students ability to capture the characteristics, personality and/or identity of the sitter

Prizes

Each of the winners will receive a \$50 voucher to Westfield Geelong and entry for two adult and two children to 2018 Art Gallery of New South Wales' *Archibald Prize* at Geelong Gallery.
