GG Connected are a young duo who help connect their peers (18 to 25 years) to Geelong Gallery through digital engagement. The program participants will gain mentoring and professional development outcomes working with the Gallery team for a 12-month tenure.

In 2023, GG Connected will showcase their passion for their Geelong and surrounds art community by building on the work of the 2022 program—continuing Art Club, aptly called GG Club 2.0. GG Connected will work closely with local artists throughout the year to promote Geelong Gallery’s 2023 exhibition program, to build stronger connections with younger audiences.


The year ahead will see Hannah and Wolf, alongside their feature artists, interpreting Geelong Gallery’s collection and exhibitions through their own lens, utilising video content across Instagram and introducing a TikTok account.

Hannah and Wolf are enthusiastic about educating and engaging their contemporaries in Geelong Gallery content, the local art landscape and encouraging participation.

Hannah and Wolf will caretake and curate these platforms, putting their stamp on Geelong Gallery’s history and community engagement.
